I recently saw one of those overshadowed details in Scripture that I have read over for years. I was astounded that I missed it. It was a group of women asking questions that had already been answered. Two Marys showed up on resurrection morning to anoint Jesus' body and bring spices for the so-called corpse. Of course, they did not expect the miracle of resurrection. Their vision was skewed and narrowed because they didn't expect that miracle. You will see it as the women visit the empty tomb.

Mark 16:1–4 (NASB) 1 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might come and anoint Him. 2 Very early on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. 3 They were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" 4 Looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away, although it was extremely large.

The question the women were asking had already been answered, but their short-sightedness couldn't see the answer in front of them. The women asked, "Who will roll away the stone for us?" I wanted to shout when I read it and say, "Ladies, the stone is rolled away. Just look!" THEY NEVER LOOKED UP, THEY ONLY LOOKED AT EACH OTHER. Verse 4 says it wasn't until they looked up, that they realized what they were asking for was already done for them.

And because they saw small, they asked things of people that God already had taken care of. Instead of living with anticipation and expectation, they reduced their faith to only corpse management. They missed the bigger job that God had prepared for them.

WHEN YOU DON'T SEE WHAT GOD WANTS YOU TO SEE, YOU END UP DOING THINGS GOD DID NOT ASK YOU TO DO. God had another assignment for these women. They thought they were in the funeral and stone removal business. Their lack of faith in the resurrection almost derailed them from the role they were to play for the resurrection morning. Remember how God was going to use these two female voices?

Mark 16:6–7 (NASB) 6 He has risen; He is not here; behold, here is the place where they laid Him. 7 But go, tell His disciples.

Mary and Mary were to be the first evangelists. Their job was to tell the disciples that Jesus had risen, not be in the stone removal business.

What a challenge for us today. What are you facing that you need God to intervene in? What tomb are you standing in front of, that you have already brought the spices to and signed the death certificate over for? Today may be an important day for you to look

up! To cease looking at people and start looking at God. You may have taken on the role of a funeral director when God wants you to be His evangelist and speak about the miracle of resurrection.

Before you sign the divorce papers, before you leave the job because of a toxic work environment, before you give up and say I will never have a baby, my womb is barren, before you settle on loneliness the rest of your life and say no one will ever love me, look up! Don't put the spices on your situation yet. Stones may have already been moved, and you just didn't see them. When the women asked "Who will roll away the stone?" their "who" was a little "w" because they were thinking of people. Let's make the "W" a capital and let's remove the question mark. Instead of asking "Who will roll away the stone?" let's declare today "God is able to resurrect my situation!"

Stop asking questions and let's make some praise declarations.

It's time to renew the evangelist in you to declare the good news that God is able.
